Bishops Cross Car Sales, Gaydon Road, Bishop's Itchington, CV47 2QW – 2 No. Folded Aluminium Facias, 1 No. set of built-up acrylic letters on rails, 1 No. projecting sign, 4 No. vinyl graphics and No. 1 post mounted totem sign.

It was **RESOLVED** to submit a response of 'No Representation' with a note to the effect that the sign should only be illuminated during the opening hours of the premises to reduce unnecessary light pollution.

- ii. The parish council noted the following planning decisions:
  - a: **23/02966/FUL:** 29 Rupert Kettle Drive, Bishop's Itchington, CV47 2PU Ground floor and first floor extension. Permission with Conditions.
  - b: **23/03062/FUL:** 31 Hambridge Road, Bishop's Itchington, CV47 2RH Erection of a single storey rear extension and erection of single storey outbuilding. Permission with Conditions.
  - c: **23/01732/FUL:** Kingston Farm, located West of Kingston Barn Cottages, Chesterton Conversion of Agricultural unit to residential dwelling and associated landscaping. Permission with Conditions.
  - d: 23/01733/FUL: Kingston Farm, located West of Kingston Barn Cottages, Chesterton Conversion of an existing agricultural unit to a single residential dwelling with associated landscaping. Permission with Conditions.

- Resurfacing of the footpath from Central Dive to the school is scheduled for the February half term,
- It has been established that the hedge along the drive to Dadglow Farm belongs to the Parish Council.
   If the hedge is cut down, footballs will land in people's properties on a regular basis and therefore, cutting the hedge down may cause more problems. It
- New trees on the POS at the junction of Gaydon Road/Chapel Street have been put in by WCC.

### 24/32 The Scene:

### 24/34 Warwickshire Fire and Rescue Service Resourcing to Risk Proposals:

It was agreed that the clerk would respond that the information provided is not adequate to make an informed response.

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### 24/35 Environment & Properties:

- i. Children's Playground Update:It was noted that the path and rubber matting work had been completed.
- ii. Works Lane anonymous letter sent to Cllr Kettle. The chairman and vice-chairman visited the site. A lorry loaded with timber was parked between Works Lane and the Itchen. No obvious signs of materials being brought in. Without evidence of commercial activity, nothing can be done. With evidence it would become a planning enforcement issue.
- iii. Parking Old Road. Ownership of the green is to be confirmed. Clerk to obtain quotes to erect bollards/posts around the green with one removable one to allow access for the grass cutting machine.
- iv. Cemetery Rules only allow stone and installed by a registered stonemason/monumental mason using the BS8415 requirement. Cllr Dugmore agreed to amend the wording to ensure it is consistent with stone. With the amendment it was RESOLVED to approve the revised cemetery rules
- Scowcroft Drive/Knightcote Road Hedge.
   It was RESOLVED to approve the cutting of the hedge at a cost of £250 plus VAT.
